The Green Campus Program Coordinators gave RAs an opportunity to win awesome Energy Star certified products for their efforts in the RA Energy Promotion Contest.

Two RAs, **Mark Darby** from **Arrowhead Village**, and **Debbie Christ** from **Serrano Village Mo-Mo Morongo Hall**, did a remarkable job promoting energy conservation to their residents and will be awarded as the winners of the Winter Quarter competition. In Mark's first program, he featured energy conservation tips and gave his residents Compact Fluorescent Lamps (CFLs). Mark's second event was a Jeopardy Game that highlighted a category he creatively titled: "To Save or Not To Save, That is the Question."

Debbie hosted a "Hall Decorating Contest" for her Hall, Mo-Mo-Morongo. Three floors participated in the competition: two girl's halls and one boy's hall. The girls made energy conservation tip posters for both of the floors. The boy's hall went above and beyond, offering signs listing their personal favorite energy savers. San Manuel with 17% reduction in Energy Consumption

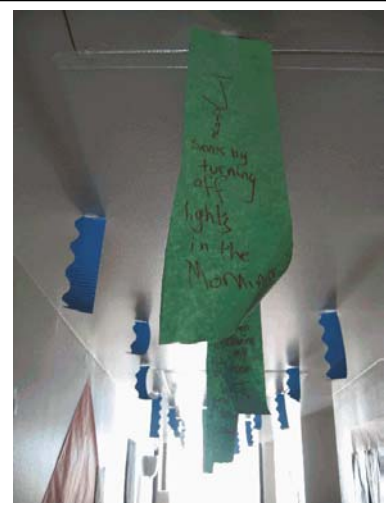
Thursday, March 23, 2006 was **Lisette Ortiz's** last day working for the Green Campus Program as a Program Coordinator.
