¹ The FY04 Budget reorganized the energy efficiency programs. The FY02 and FY03 numbers are in the reorganized categories.

² The FY02 appropriation was \$912.805 million. The FY03 appropriation after a 0.65% rescission was \$891.769 million. Actual spending is reduced mostly by a mandated transfer of 2.65% of extramural R&D funds for SBIR/STTR.

³ The FY04 appropriation reflects overall rescissions of 0.646% and 0.59%.

⁴ The House Appropriations Committee transferred weatherization program funding to the Labor-HHS Subcommittee. The changes from FY 2004 are based on the remaining programs.

⁵ Most of the Energy Star program is at EPA, funded through the VA-HUD appropriations bill.
